-Meeting started at 7:00 with 4 executive officers, 3 BOD members, 13 members and 1 past president present.

-Secretaries minutes read and accepted.

-Treasurer's minutes read showing \$14,000 so far in new memberships. Three new members present for tonight's meeting. Total \$167,512.29 in all accounts. Some large expenses upcoming.

Membership totals: 160-Annual, 122-Senior, 83-Family, 4-Life time and 10-Student.

-Facilities report by Greg Isles states lots to do at Saturdays Work Bee including wood targets, staining, attention to the tool shed and warming hut.

\$500 set aside for new tent structure behind warming hut.

Steve P states steel targets on the 100 yrd range taking a beating from large caliber rounds being fired. Suggests signs made to inform members of caliber restrictions on the range. Basically NO MAGNUM ROUNDS.

Kris suggests the damaged targets displayed for members to view.

Road repairs will be scheduled at a later date. Paving would cost a lot of money. Might consider paving sections at a time.

-Changing MEMBER'S MEETINGS to quarterly discussed. No vote necessary as most people would like to keep it monthly. Ideas to increase attendance are cooking burgers and such before meeting, having speakers and doing some shooting demonstrations etc before the meeting.

At this point having wings set up for members seems to have positive results.

-Ad-hoc meetings for Skeet improvements and range instructor guide lines set for 5/1 and 4/24.

-Bob G announced the MENTOR NIGHT program will resume this summer but will be by reservation this year so a one on one with mentor and mentorie will be maintained.

-Larry K suggest a program for displaying various fire arms on a range where members can actually fire them under the guidance of the owners.

-Julie suggest dry fire programs to be scheduled in the club house when winter weather drives everyone inside.
